

## First Generation

1. **Wesley Harold GOULD** was born on 13 Feb 1909 in Kenora, Ontario, Canada. He died on 27 Dec 1991 at the age of 82 in Fargo, Cass County, North Dakota. He was buried in Jan 1992 in Casselton Cemetery, Casselton County, North Dakota.



In 1930 and 1940, Harold and LaVerne and family were living in Casselton, Cass County, North Dakota.

Harold enlisted in the U. S. Navy on 5 May 1944 and on 30 June 1944 he is a member of the USS SNYDER (DE 745) crew.

## Second Generation

2. **George E. GOULD**<sup>1-2</sup> was born on 9 Jul 1872 in Liverpool, Lanchashire Co, ENG. He was buried in Sep 1950 in Casselton Cemetery, Casselton County, North Dakota. He died on 21 Sep 1950 at the age of 78 in Fargo, Cass County, North Dakota.



It is possible he reversed his first/middle names from E.G. to G.E. Tracy Gould remembers her father saying his name was Elliott.

Family history says he came from Liverpool, England to Ontario, Canada at 16 years old.

In 1901 census he is living in a boarding house in Mikado Mine, Algoma, Ontario.

In 1905 the Simcoe County, Ontario, Canada Marriage Registration Number 016922 lists him as a Miner. Sally FLATT Brown, although not knowing George GOULD's name, knew from family history that Emogene FLATT married a miner working at the Mikado Gold Mine, Kenora, Ontario, Canada. She also discovered a folder in her local (Canada) library which has the inhabitants of the Mikado Mines in 1901. "George Gould 1872 Eng" is included in the list.

In 1910 Emogene's naturalization records indicate George entered the United States at Neche, North Dakota in September 1910, two months after Emogene did and they lived in Gardner, Cass County, North Dakota.

In 1920 George and Emogene and five children are living on the Tamar FLATT farm in Kinyon Township, Cass County, [Note: part of Gardner is in Kinyon Township].

In 1921 the family moved to Mayville, Traill County, but it is believed that sometime between Gardner and Mayville they lived in Shotley, Beltrami County, Minnesota.

In 1925 and 1930 the family is living in Mayville with George a self-employed farmer.

In 1940 the family is living in Casselton, Cass County where George is not working and Emogene is a Seamstress. Emogene FLATT and George E. GOULD were married on 25 Oct 1905 in Kenora, Ontario, Canada.

On his marriage application, Canada Marriage Registration Number 016922, he lists his parents as Stephen and Annie Gould.

3. **Emogene FLATT**<sup>1-3</sup> was born on 26 Jan 1880 in Fargo, Cass County, Dakota Territory. She died on 22 Jun 1974 at the age of 94 in Moorhead, Clay County, Minnesota. She was buried in 1974 in Casselton Cemetery, Casselton County, North Dakota.



In 1880 Census, Page 23, Dwelling 160, she is living in Fargo, Dakota Territory. Family history has Emogene and Eugene as first recorded twins born in Dakota Territory.

In 1885 Dakota Territory census the family living in Cass County.

In 1900 Census she is living on the family farm in Kinyon Township, Cass County.

Sally FLATT Brown records a story that Emogene's brother, Si (Sally's grandfather), living in Canada, asked Emogene to come to Canada and take care of the children and help run the family business as Si's wife, Hannah, was very ill. Emogene went to Canada immediately and when she arrived she discovered that Hannah was just fine and had been all along. It was a hoax and the only way Si thought Emogene would come to Canada as Si had met a man who was working for him and thought this man (George GOULD) would be perfect for Emogene!

It is not understood why she petitioned for US Naturalization since she was born in North Dakota unless the laws at that time required it since she married in Canada. She petitioned for Naturalization on 6 May 1939 with Alice and Rudy Mundt as witnesses and took the Oath of Allegiance on 9 May 1939. The papers indicate she entered the United States at Neche, North Dakota in July 1910 on the Great Northern and C. P. Railroad.

## Third Generation

### 4. **Stephen GOULD**<sup>1</sup> was born (date unknown).

Stephen being George's father is yet to be confirmed [2015]. In family hand-me-down information, but unconfirmed, is that Stephen is believed to have remarried after Anna died about 1878 - 1880. It is believed Stephen died in a goldmine. Besides George, there may be a younger brother (3-6 years) named Stephen/Steven who might have settled in the New York City area. Also not confirmed are two other brothers Alfred and Earl and two sisters (one a half sister named Rose). Annie UNKNOWN and Stephen GOULD were married.

### 5. **Annie UNKNOWN**<sup>1</sup> died between 1878 and 1880.<sup>1</sup>

Family hand-me-down information, yet unconfirmed, is that Annie died when son George was about eight years old.

### 6. **Josiah (Jesse) FLATT**<sup>1,3-8</sup> was born on 2 Oct 1828 in Kenninghall, Norfolk, England.



Josiah's birth date has been recorded as 1828, 1831, 1832, and 1834. He was baptized on 2 Oct 1828 in Kenninghall, Norfolk, England.

From FreeReg U.K. Parish Register Information, Baptism File Number 8630. He immigrated about 1847 to Ontario, Canada. Josiah immigrated about 1875 to Moorhead, Clay County, Minnesota. He was naturalized on 3 Nov 1890 in Cass County, North Dakota.<sup>9</sup>

The State of North Dakota, Cass County Naturalization Papers, Page 251, dated 3 November 1890, Volume F-23, indicate he was born in England in 1834 and emigrated to America in February 1878. He filed his intention to become naturalized on 7 April 1879 and took his oath of office on 3 November 1890. He was buried in Mar 1910 at Rose Valley Cemetery in Gardner, Cass County, North Dakota.

The family firmly believes Josiah was buried at Rose Valley Cemetery, west of Gardner, Cass County, North Dakota. This cemetery was part of, and next to, the Methodist Church in the area. The church is no longer there. There is no headstone with Josiah's name on it; however, there is a large FLATT family plot headstone. Descendant Joel Flatt found the cemetery had many periods of not being maintained resulting in damaged and missing stones. In the "Cass County Cemeteries, Vol 2, 1972, Compiled by Red River Valley Genealogical Society" it stated many of the remains had been removed from the cemetery. Josiah died on 12 Mar 1910 at the age of 81 in Gardner, Cass County, North Dakota.

Josiah emigrated from England to Ontario, Canada but the year is uncertain. Probably between 1846 and 1849. He lived in Adjala, Simcoe County, Ontario 1853-1858 and in Tecumseth, Simcoe County, Ontario 1854-1856. It is strongly believed, but undocumented, that he emigrated with his parents and siblings.

In the 1871 Canada Census of Ontario he is listed as Jasey, age 42, born in England, and a farmer along with Rachel, his wife, and eight children in Mulmur, Simcoe South, Ontario, Canada..

In 1872 Josiah's first marriage to Rachel LYONS ended with her death. It is believed Rachel was scared by a bull when pregnant with Louisa and went into labor. Louisa survived but Rachel did not. There were ten children from that marriage all born in Simcoe, Ontario, Canada.

In 1873 Josiah married Tamar Whitley. The Simcoe County, Ontario County, Canada Marriage Registration Document Number 010417 has his name as Isaiah; lists both Josiah and Tamar as Methodists, the marriage conducted by Thomas Campbell, witnessed by Hester FLATT of Tecumseth and James FLATT of Mono, both residing in Mulmer when married. It is possible that this is Josiah's brother, James, and James' daughter Ester. Josiah was a farmer and Tamar a spinster. There were

eleven children from that marriage.

The Grandin, North Dakota Centennial 1881-1891 Publication indicates he immigrated to Moorhead, Clay County, Minnesota in 1875, and his family came a year later and settled on a farm near Gardner, North Dakota.

In the 1880 Census, Josiah is living with Tamar and five children in Fargo, Dakota Territory and indicates he is a laborer, he was born in England and his parents were born in England. He gave his age at last birthday as 48.

The 1884 Fargo Directory lists Josiah and Tamar as living on 6th Avenue between Park and Cass Streets.

The State of North Dakota, Cass County Naturalization Papers, Page 251, dated 3 Nov 1890, Volume F-23, indicate he was born in England in 1834 and emigrated to America in February 1878. He filed his intention to become naturalized on 7 April 1879 and took his oath of office on 3 November 1890.

In the 1900 Census it indicates he is a farm owner in Kinyon Township, Cass County, North Dakota and he entered the United States in 1878. It gives his birth date as Oct 1832.

The Compendium of History and Biography of North Dakota, Chicago: George A. Ogle and Co., 1900, contains this article (except for the notes): "One of the early settlers of Cass County resides on Section 28, in Kinyon Township (note: Kinyon is Township 143, Range 50) and is well known and highly respected in his community. He was born in the county of Norfolk, England, 7 October 1832 (note this year differs from the naturalization papers) and when about 16 (note this contradicts Norfolk 1851 census if we have the correct James Flatt Norfolk census) emigrated to America and settled in Simcoe County, Ontario, Canada where he remained until 1878 (conflicts with the Gardner, Cass County, North Dakota Centennial publication). In the spring of that year he went to North Dakota and for several years made his home in Fargo, while he was engaged in farming in that vicinity. He purchased 480 acres of land in Section 28 in Kinyon Township in the summer of 1886 and has resided thereon since that time. He has made valuable improvements to his property and has met with success in the pursuit of agriculture. He was married to his second wife in Simcoe County, Ontario, Canada 25 March 1875 (note it was actually 1873) to Miss Tamar Whitley, who was born in Simcoe County 14 February 1852. Mr and Mrs Flatt are the parents of 9 living children, as follows: Thomas G, Josiah, Jr., Emogene, Charlotte, Eugene, Wesley, Walter, Earl, and May. Four children born to Mr. and Mrs. Flatt died in infancy or childhood, as follows: Hannah, Eugene, Pearl, and an infant unnamed. Mr. Flatt is a prominent citizen and active in social and religious affairs of his community and enjoys the respect and esteem of the people among whom he has resided for many years."

North Dakota History and People Outlines of American History Volume I Chicago The S.J. Clarke Publishing Company 1917, contains this article: "Josiah Flatt came to Canada at the age of 14 (1848). Married Rachel Lyons about 1853. Josiah and Rachel had eight children. Rachel died. Josiah marries Tamar Whitley in Ontario in 1873. Moved to Fargo in 1878: seven years later purchased 480 acre farm in Cass County. Josiah and Tamar had 13 children."

North Dakota History and People Outlines of American History Volume II Chicago The S.J. Clarke Publishing Company 1917, Josiah Flatt p.619-620 contains this article: "For a considerable period Josiah Flatt was numbered among the progressive and enterprising agriculturists of Cass County and won success through his earnest, persistent efforts. He was born in England, October 7, 1834 and there spent the days of his boyhood and youth until he crossed the Atlantic to Canada when fourteen years of age. He remained a resident of that country until 1878, which year witnessed his arrival in North Dakota. He took up his abode at Fargo, where he remained for seven years and then purchased the farm that his widow still occupies, becoming the owner of 480 acres of rich and productive land on section 28, Kinyon township, Cass County. He at once began to develop and improve the property and thereon erected a number of buildings and added other modern equipment. Mr. Flatt was twice married. In Canada he wedded Miss Rachel Lyons, who passed away in that country and by whom he had eight children. In 1873 Mr. Flatt was again married, his second union being with Miss Tamar Whitley, a native of Canada and a daughter of William and Abigail (Hughson) Whitley, both of whom passed away in that

country. By his second wife Mr. Flatt had thirteen children, of whom the following survive: Thomas G., who follows farming in Cass county, Josiah; Wesley; Walter, at home; Emma G., who is the wife of George Gould; Edna May, who gave her hand in marriage to Warren Collins; and Earl, who is still at home. The death of the husband and father occurred March 12, 1910, and he was laid to rest in the Rose Valley cemetery, leaving a widow and seven children to mourn his loss. She still gives personal supervision to the operation of the farm and displays good business ability in management. She belongs to the Free Methodist church, in the work of which she takes an active and helpful part, and her well spent life has gained her high regard wherever she is known. Mr. Flatt was also a consistent Christian, belonging to the Free Methodist church, and in his political views he was an earnest democrat but he never sought nor held office. He was much interested in the schools of the community and the cause of education found in him a stalwart champion. In his business career his record was one of steady progress resulting from indefatigable energy, persistency of purpose and honorable dealing, and thus it was that he was able to leave his widow in very comfortable financial circumstances." Tamar Jean WHITLEY and Josiah (Jesse) FLATT were married on 25 Mar 1873 in Rosemont, Simcoe County, Ontario, Canada.

Ontario Vital Statistics Project, Marriages. Transcribed from Archives of Ontario, microfilm series 932: "10417-73 Isaiah FLATT, 41 widower, farmer, England, Mulmur, s/o James & Julia, married Tamar WHITLEY, 21, Mulmur, same, d/o William & Abigail, witn: Hester FLATT of Tecumseth & James FLATT of Mono, 25 March 1873 at Tossoronito."

7. **Tamar Jean WHITLEY**<sup>1,3,10</sup> was born on 14 Feb 1852 in Mulmur, Dufferin County, Ontario, Canada.



She died on 14 Jul 1935 at the age of 83 in Casselton, Cass County, North Dakota. She was buried in 1936 in Casselton Cemetery, Casselton County, North Dakota.

In the 1871 Canada Census she is living in Mulmar, Simcoe County, Canada, with her widowed mother and two brothers Robert and William She is age 19, birthplace Ontario, nationality Irish, and Religion W Methodist.

The North Dakota 1880 Census has her living in Fargo, Dakota Territory. She is keeping house and indicates she was born in Canada, her father born in Ireland and her mother born in Canada.

In the North Dakota 1900 Census she is living on a farm with her family in Kinyon Township, Cass County, North Dakota. It indicates she entered the US in 1879 and as of 1900 nine of her thirteen children are alive.

In the 1910 Census she is still living on the Kinyon farm with her oldest son Thomas listed has the head.

In the 1920 Census she is still in Kinyon and her her son Walter and daughter Emogene and her family and living with her.

In the 1930 Census she is living in Amenia Village, Cass County, North Dakota, Dwelling 13, and her son Walter is living with her.

## Fourth Generation

12. **James FLATT**<sup>6-8,11</sup> was born about 1776 in Kenninghall, Norfolk, England.

James' birth date could be between 1776 which is indicated in Find A Grave Memorial and 1781 which is a baptismal date. He was baptized on 15 Jul 1781.

From the U.K. Parish Register Information, Baptism File Number 11965.

He was buried in Jul 1864 at Monkman's Cemetery in Tecumseth, Simcoe County, Ontario, Canada. James died on 12 Jul 1864 at the age of 88 in Ontario, Canada.

Some of the records in the church of St. Mary at Kenninghall, Norfolk, England show several infant deaths but with available documentation (like birth/baptism registrations) it cannot be definitely determined they are children of James and Judith.

Judah (Judith, Julia) BETTS and James FLATT were married on 7 Jun 1804 in Kenninghall, Norfolk, England.

FreeReg U.K. Parish Register Information, File Number 11975.

13. **Judah (Judith, Julia) BETTS**<sup>6</sup> was baptized on 12 Apr 1772 at St. Peter and St. Paul Church in Heydon, Norfolk, England.<sup>7</sup> She was buried in Feb 1857 at Monkman's Cemetery in Tecumseth, Simcoe County, Ontario, Canada. She died on 14 Feb 1857 in Ontario, Canada.

There are two references for her death date: 14 Feb 1857 age 82 and 1861 age 83.

Her surname has been reported as HUNTER and as BETTS.

14. **William WHITLEY**<sup>10,12</sup> was born in 1810–1816 in Ireland.

Birth date varies because of census reports. Son William Henry's death certificate indicates his father was born in Mulmur, Ontario. He died after 1860 at the age of 50 in Canada.

May possibly have been born in England.

A yeoman of Mulmur Township when married in 1831.

In the Canada 1861 census, "Wiliam Whitly" is living in Mono Township, Simcoe County, Canada indicating he was born in Ireland. With him are Abigail, George, Ann, Robert, Tamar, and William all born in Canada and members of the English Church.

Abigail HUGHSON and William WHITLEY were married on 28 Apr 1831 in Ancaster, Wentworth County, Canada.

The bondsmen for this marriage were Lewis Horning of Barton and James Whitley of Mulmur.

15. **Abigail HUGHSON**<sup>10,12</sup> was born in 1813 in Binbrook, Ontario, Canada.

William Henry's death certificate indicates Abigail was born in Binbrook, Ontario. She died on 15 Jan 1897 at the age of 84 in Dufferin County, Ontario, Canada.

The person making the death record return was Isaac G. Houston (probably her nephew, Isaac Griffith Hughson of Mulmur). Died of paralysis after five days of illness.

Some evidence that this Abigail is the daughter of George and Phoebe is that they did have children born in the 1812-1814 period and did have a daughter Abigail. Members of George's family did have connections to Mulmur families. Abigail's birth date appears to be pinned down in both directions as she couldn't be born much earlier than 1812 and still have William about 1854 and she couldn't be born much later than 1814 and gotten married in 1831. Despite Abigail and William appearing to have waited from 1831 until 1842 it's quite possible and probable there were other children before 1842 which haven't been documented.

Abigail was single and living in Barton, Wentworth County, Canada at the time of her marriage in

1831.

Abigail is a widow in 1871, aged 58, and living with three children, Robert, Tamer, and William. All house members are W. Methodist religion and living as farmers D Division, South Simcoe, Ontario, Canada.

Abigail is a widow in 1881, aged 68, and living in Tossorontio Township, Simcoe County South with her son William.

In the 1891 census she is living with her daughter, Hannah, in Mulmur, Simcoe County.

Abigail was listed as a Methodist in her death record.



## Fifth Generation

24. **Richard FLATT**<sup>7</sup> was born about 1745. He died on 19 Feb 1808 at the age of 63 in Kenninghall, Norfolk, England.

From FreeReg U.K. Parish Register Information, Burial File Number 11969. Mary ELSEY and Richard FLATT were married on 16 Oct 1769 in Kenninghall, Norfolk, England.

25. **Mary ELSEY**<sup>7</sup> was born about 1741. She was buried 15 Aug 11827 in Kenninghall, Norfolk, England.

From FreeReg U.K. Parish Register Information, Death File Number 11971.

30. **George HUGHSON**<sup>12-13</sup> was born on 10 May 1786 in New Brunswick. Phebe GRIFFITH and George HUGHSON were married on 6 Jun 1811 in Barton Township, Niagara District, Lincoln County, Ontario, Canada.<sup>13</sup>

31. **Phebe GRIFFITH**<sup>13</sup> was born on 28 Apr 1789 in New York.<sup>13</sup>

## Sixth Generation

50. **Gorge (George) ELSEY (ELCEY, ELSIE)**<sup>7</sup> was born in 1704. He died in 1771 at the age of 67.

51. **Hannah (Ann) UNKNOWN**<sup>7</sup> was born in 1726. She died in 1769 at the age of 43.

60. **Nathaniel HUGHSON** was born (date unknown). Rebecca LAND and Nathaniel HUGHSON were married.

61. **Rebecca LAND**<sup>12</sup> was born (date unknown).

62. **Lazarus, Jr. GRIFFITH**<sup>13-14</sup> was born on 5 Nov 1736 in Harwich, Barnstable County, Massachusetts.<sup>13-14</sup>

The Beekman Patent has his birth date as 5 June 1739 and Massachusetts Vital Records has it as 5 November 1736. In one of his military muster rolls on 18 April 1758, it indicates he was 21 which would favor the 1736 date over the 1739 date. The Beekman Patent indicates that his muster rolls showed his birth place as Cap [sic] Cod (Cape Cod). He died in 1802-1810 at the age of 66 in Beverley Township, Ontario, Canada.<sup>13</sup>

In 1758 he is listed on two military muster rolls in Queens County, New York. In the first roll, only his name is listed. In the second muster he was age 21, mustered with Captain Hulet's Company on 18 April 1758. It indicated he had a brown complexion and enlisted on 11 April 1758 and that he was a laborer born in Cap [sic] Cod (Cape Cod).

The Beekman Patent is quoted, "He then came to the South Precinct with his father and was taxed there and in Fredericksburgh from 1769 through 1779. He was assessed at 1 pound in Fredericksburgh in 1777". (South Precinct and Fredericksburgh are in Dutchess County.)

As a result of his service in the 7th Regiment of Dutchess County Militia, he was awarded Land Bounty Rights.

In 1790 he is in Mamakating Town, Ulster County, New York. As with all pre-1850 census reports the family configuration is difficult to determine. The Beekman patent indicates that Joshua "had to belong to someone, either Lazarus or Nathan." (Note: possibly another son of Lazarus, Senior). With a birth date of about 1763, Hannah would only have been about eight years old so this writer has dropped Joshua as a Lazarus/Hannah descendant.

After the 1790 census he went to Upper Canada just west of Hamilton County, Ontario. Hannah UNKNOWN and Lazarus, Jr. GRIFFITH were married before 1773.<sup>14</sup>

63. **Hannah UNKNOWN**<sup>13-14</sup> was born about 1755. She died after 1824 at the age of 69.<sup>13</sup>

Living in Ontario on 6 February 1824.

**Seventh Generation**

124. **Lazarus GRIFFITH**<sup>13</sup> was born on 7 Jun 1708 in Harwich, Barnstable County, Massachusetts.<sup>13-14</sup> He died about 1771 at the age of 63.<sup>13</sup>

Shortly after their marriage they went to Middletown, Middlesex County, Connecticut.

It is believed by Beekman's Patent that Lazarus went to New York City or Brooklyn about 1752 but had come to the South Precinct of Dutchess County, New York by February 1753 and remained through 1771 when he evidently died. Marriage location is apparently in Eastham, Barnstable County, Massachusetts.

He was a tenant in Lot 8 of the Philips Patent [Note: Philipse, formerly Highland Patent in Province of New York, now Putnam County].

Lazarus was an inhabitant of the Western Society of Philippi (Southern Precinct, Dutchess County), signed the call for Rev. Knibloe in 1756.

Lydia DOANE and Lazarus GRIFFITH were married on 30 Sep 1731.<sup>13,15</sup>

The source is not consistent. It indicates intentions were filed on 3 September 1731, but on Page 32 it indicates they were married on 2 September by Joseph Doane, Justice of the Peace and Town Clerk. On Page 33 it indicates they were married on 30 September. When married, Lazarus was living in Harwich and Lydia in Eastham both of Barnstable County.

125. **Lydia DOANE**<sup>13</sup> was born on 9 Feb 1714 in Orleans, Barnstable County, Massachusetts.<sup>15</sup>

Lydia was admitted on 16 March 1734/5 to the First Church in Brewster [Note: Barnstable County, Massachusetts] and was dismissed from that church to the Church in Middle Haddam, Connecticut [Note: Middlesex County] on 16 August 1747.

## Eighth Generation

248. **Stephen GRIFFITH**<sup>13-14</sup> was born (date unknown). Rebekah UNKNOWN and Stephen GRIFFITH were married.

249. **Rebekah UNKNOWN**<sup>13-14</sup> was born (date unknown).

250. **Joseph DOANE**<sup>15</sup> was born (date unknown). Mary GODFREY and Joseph DOANE were married on 8 Jan 1690.

251. **Mary GODFREY**<sup>15</sup> was born on 2 Jun 1672. She died on 22 Jan 1725 at the age of 52.

## **Ninth Generation**

502. **George GODFREY** was born (date unknown). George GODFREY was married.
